The SBWIB Business & Economic Committee Approve Regional Economic Development (RED) Team Activities

The SBWIB works closely with economic development officers within the South Bay region and meets on a regular basis with the South Bay Cities Council of Government's Economic Development Directors Roundtable Group.

Recently the Business & Economic Development Committee gave approval for the SBWIB to continue and expand the activities of the Regional Economic Development (RED) Team.



The RED Team organizes regional economic development strategies and responds when a local company indicates they are in financial trouble or are considering to leave the area for other reasons. Many times a company will reach out to the SBWIB or their local city for help and/or advice in anticipation of difficulties ahead. When this happens, a group of economic development professionals are pulled together to meet with the company to discuss options and financial incentives that may be available to them.

The RED Team is a business retention layoff aversion program that is very effective at retaining business and saving jobs in the South Bay.

Currently the RED team includes: One or more members of the SBWIB staff, the economic development director or equivalent from the city where the company is located, the Los Angeles County Economic Development Corporation (LAEDC), GO Biz - The California Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development and a representative from Southern California Edison.

The work of the RED Team takes place in advance of a WARN notice and is in addition to other layoff aversion efforts.

Receive an Employee for 10 months at NO COST!

Attention All Non-Profit Organizations & Government Agencies



Receive a minimum wage employee for 10 months at no cost.

How It Works:

- Individuals are paid minimum wage and may work up to 40 hours per week.
- South Bay WIB serves as Employer of Record and covers all wage, tax and workers' compensation costs.
- Programs last 10 months in duration.
- Individuals are expected to learn new skills, enhance existing ones, develop work behaviors, and acquire a work references upon the completion of the assignment.
- Your supervision and guidance of the individual, as well as the completion of the individual's progress reports are needed.


Now Recruiting! High School Seniors for the Fit for Gold Tutoring & Fitness Academy
