# DISCOVERY, EDUCATION & SHARING



Created in 2005, the *Angkor Photo Festival* is the first photography festival to be held in Southeast Asia. Each year the weeklong event features exhibitions and outdoor slideshows by celebrated and emerging photographers in Siem Reap.





The strong educational goals of the *Angkor Photo Festival* sets it apart from other photography events. At the free *Angkor Photo Workshops*, renowned photographers tutor emerging Asian photographers, while the festival operates its own outreach program, the *Anjali Children's Photo Workshops*.

## 2012 PROGRAM

Like the previous editions, the 8<sup>th</sup> Angkor Photo Festival does not have a themed program, but proposes to discover - or rediscover - artists from all over the world.

This year, we received more than 1,200 submissions of work from 67 different countries.

Consistent with the festival's mission of highlighting emerging Asian photographers, 60 of the 130 exhibiting photographers in 2012 are from Asia.

Angkor Photo Festival is a place to meet, connect and dialogue with friends and fellow photography professionals.

The 2012 program of 10 outdoor and indoor exhibitions and 8 evenings of outdoor slideshows is curated by:

> Françoise Callier, the Program Coordinator of the *Angkor Photo Festival*, in consultation with a 9-member international committee from 7 different countries.

Each year, the festival dedicates 2 evenings of slideshows as a « Carte Blanche » to two well-known figures in photography.

## **BLOWUP** Angkor



A new initiative that began in 2010, *BlowUp Angkor* is a series of free and open street exhibitions displayed in public spaces.

Organised by *blindboys.org*, over 600 prints from 35 photographers are put up at various locations all over Siem Reap. The intiative aims to infuse photography with the everyday lives of the community, and to reach out to new audiences.

- > Françoise Callier has worked 15 years at 2e Bureau as a photographer's agent, working with Helmut Newton, Jean-Paul Goude, Max Vadukul and many others. She handled with Sylvie Grumbach the press promotions at Visa pour l'Image in Perpignan, and from 1995 to 1998, she was also the French correspondent for Corbis. Since 2006, she has been the program coordinator of the Angkor Photo Festival.
- > Bangladeshi photographer Munem Wasif began his career as a feature photographer in leading newspapers in Bangladesh. In 2007, he joined the Angkor Photo Workshops and was selected for the World Press Photo Joop Swart Masterclass. In 2008, he received the F25 Prize from La Fabrica and the Young Reporter Award at the Visa pour l'Image festival. Recently selected as one of 30 emerging photographers by Photo District News, his work has been widely published and exhibited, and he now teaches at Pathshala South Asian Media Academy.
