# Direct Quotations

- **Direct Quotations** provide a writers' exact words inside quotation marks.
- Albert Einstein said, "Logic will get you from A to B. Imagination will take you everywhere."





# Indirect Quotations

- **Indirect quotations** give the meaning of an authors' words without using quotation marks.
- Albert Einstein said that imagination is boundless, and will take you everywhere.





# Summary

- A summary is a short paragraph that describes the main idea and supporting points of a longer work. It is written in your own words and does not include direct quotations.





# Paraphrase

- **Paraphrase** means to reword information from an original source using your own words, without using direct quotations.

## Original Text:

- Albert Einstein said, “Logic will get you from A to B. Imagination will take you everywhere.”

## Your Paraphrase:

- Albert Einstein said that imagination is boundless, but logic is limited.



# Plagiarism

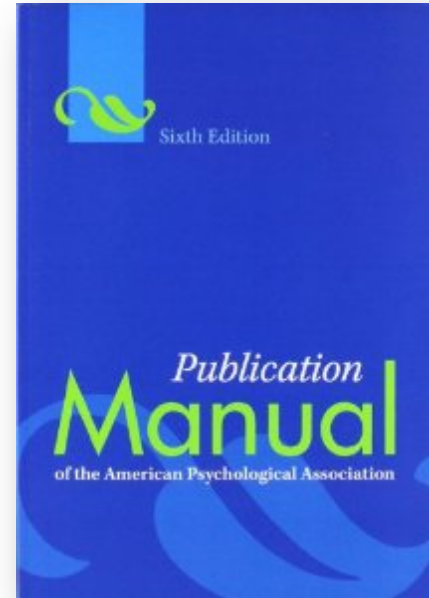
- **Plagiarism** is using someone else's words without giving them proper credit in your essay.
- Plagiarism is stealing another writer's work.

# APA/ Bibliography

- **APA** is a research documentation style created by the American Psychological Association.
- A **Bibliography** page is the last page of an APA essay that lists all of the outside sources used within your paper.





# MLA/ Works Cited

- **MLA** is a research documentation style created by the Modern Language Association.
- A **Works Cited** page is the last page of an MLA essay that lists all of the outside sources used within your paper.







# Search Engine

- A page on the Internet that uses key words to locate other websites.
- Researchers use **search engines** to find information on the Internet.
