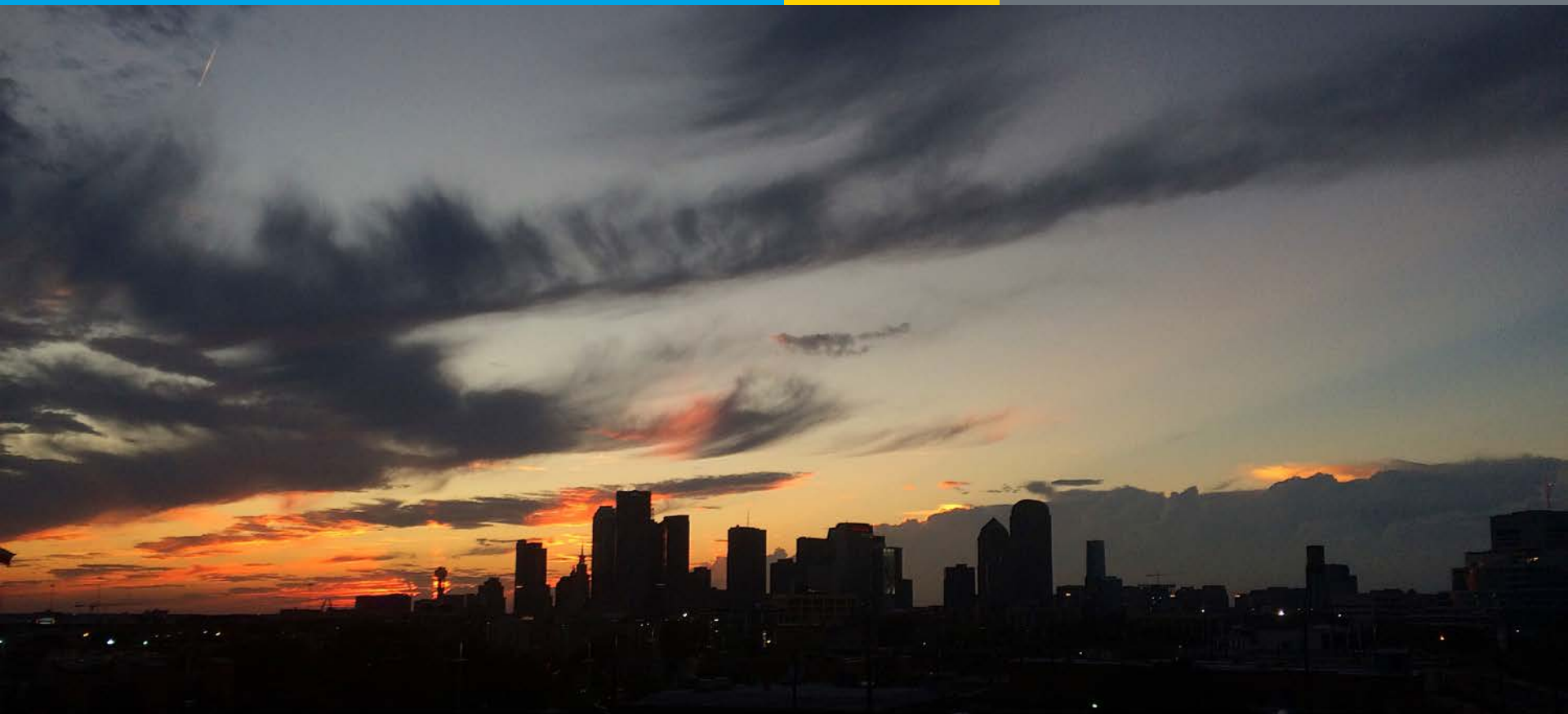



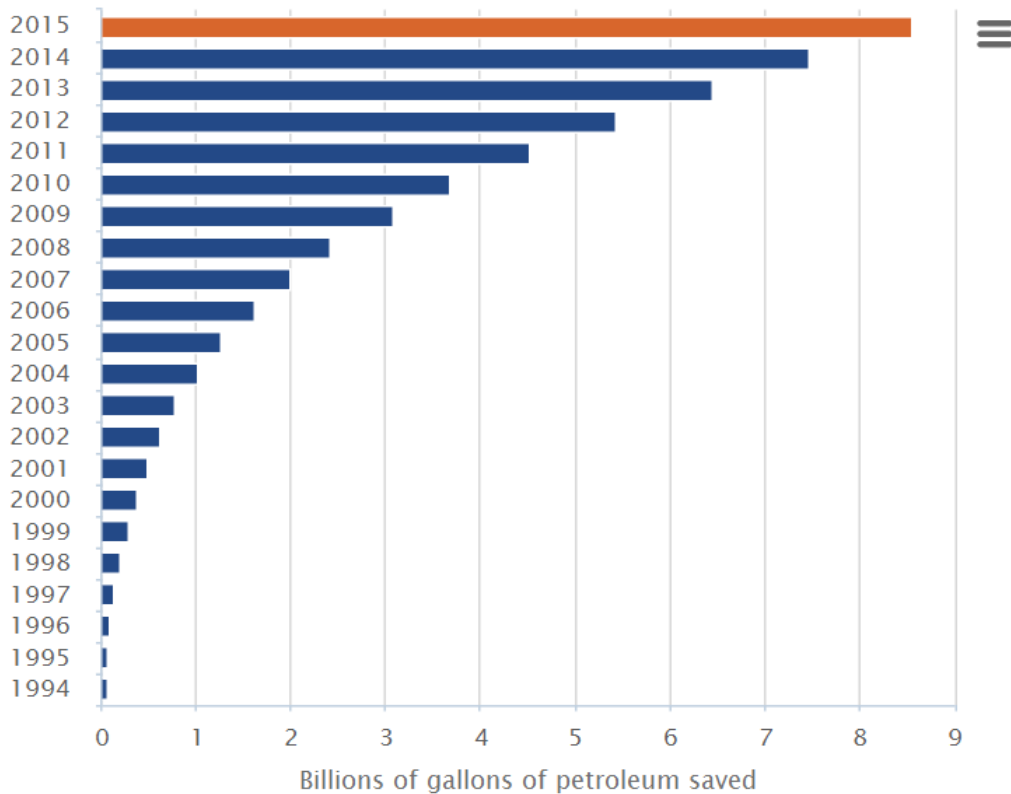

Clean Cities Cumulative Petroleum Savings



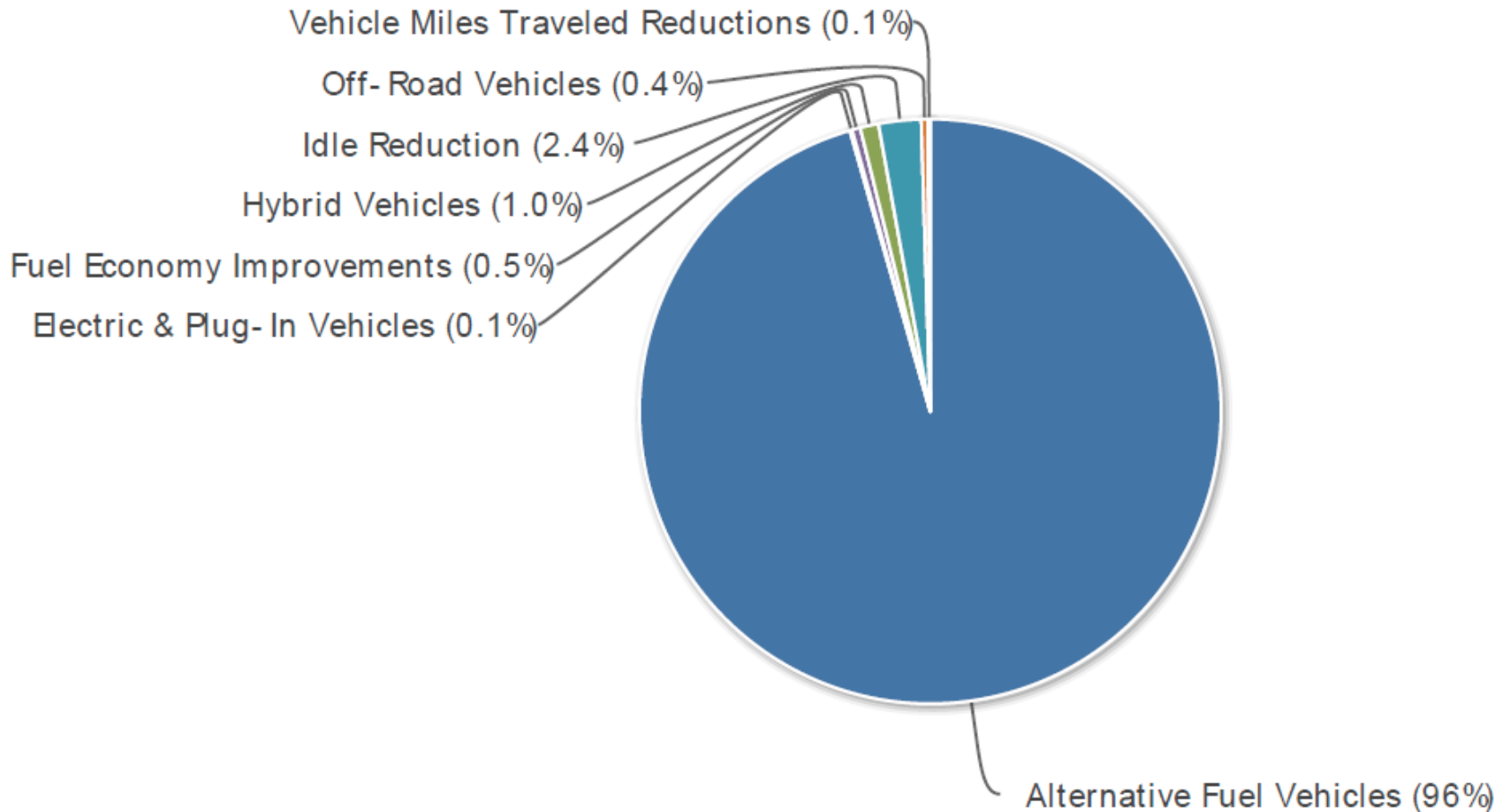
Since its inception in 1993, Clean Cities has eliminated the need for more than 8.5 billion gallons* of petroleum through alternative fuel use, fuel economy improvements, idle-reduction measures, and other strategies.

**Petroleum savings include both gasoline and diesel fuel. Savings are measured in gasoline-gallon equivalents (GGEs), representing a quantity of fuel with the same energy content as a gallon of gasoline.*

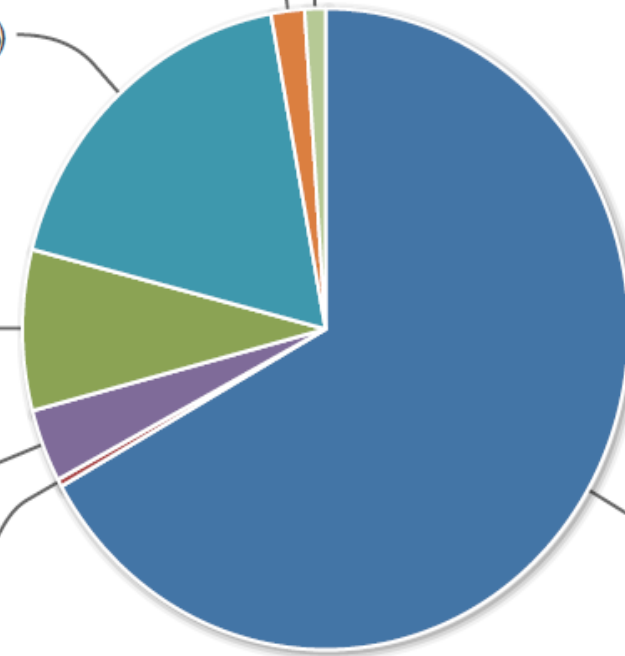
