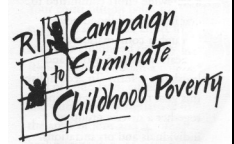

Legislative Agenda 2007

Utilities, Food and Income on the Agenda:

Amend the Comprehensive Energy Conservation, Efficiency & Affordability Act of 2006

2007 Bill S-0384 and H-5909 to Amend the 2006 energy act. Moving forward from legislation with a forgiveness plan, small discounts and an energy fund in place, we want this bill to work for the people who need it. Key changes to be discussed at the forums, with expert presenters on March 24th. (See page 4.)

No Shut-offs in homes with children under 6!

2007 Bill S-0546 and H-5302 to ban utility shut-offs in financially-needy homes with children under six. No child should be cold! RI Senate Sponsors: Sens. Sosnowski, Miller, Moura, Pichardo, and Metts. RI House Sponsors: Sponsors: Reps. Naughton, Handy, Corvese, Dennigan, and Gemma.

Increase to the R.I. Earned Income Tax Credit

2007 Bill S-0169 and H-6042. RI Senate Sponsors: Sens. Metts, Levesque, Perry, and Doyle. House Sponsors: Reps. Slater, Almeida, Diaz, Dennigan, and Williams. A fair tax break for working people.

Universal Free Breakfast for all Rhode Island Children

2007 Bill pending. A phased in mandate for all public schools to offer universal school breakfast. Participation in this federally funded program doubles when school breakfast is offered at no cost to the students. This bill provides relief to family food budgets and increases students' readiness to learn, attendance, decreases hunger and ultimately improves their school performance.

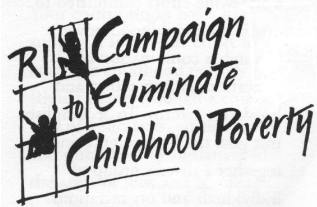

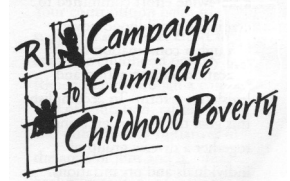

2007 Bill S-0384 and H-5909 Details: - Sponsors: Senators Miller, Pichardo, C. Levesque and Sosnowski
H-5909 sponsors: Reps. Handy, Pacheco, Slater, Kilmartin, Silva

First, the Affordable Energy Plan needs to include all households eligible for federal LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program). This includes all households at or below 225% of the Federal Poverty Level.

- Distribution charges are a small percentage of the bill. Discounts on gas and electric distribution fees should increase to 100% (currently up to 50%). Discounts on oil would be available up to 50% (currently up to 25%).

- Forgiveness Plan: Current legislation details how people with terminated service can have their electric and gas restored via a payment plan that includes forgiveness on a portion of the past due bill. To ensure that the plan will work, the following amendments are required: 1) the customer would be required to make an 18% down payment (currently 25% down payment is required). 2) Any customer eligible for LIHEAP who is terminated, or who receives notice of a termination, shall be qualified to enter in the program. 3) Upon each month's payment one percent (1%) of the unpaid balance shall be forgiven. 4) a customer will be dropped from the re-payment program after 3 consecutive months of failure to comply. (Instead of one month).

- Right to move: New service may not be refused to a New service may not be refused to a LIHEAP customer on an unpaid balance that has been outstanding for more than 3 years – such unpaid balance would be treated as a "Bad Debt" by the gas and/or electric company.

- Weatherization: The utility company shall refer all LIHEAP customers to local Community Action Programs (CAP) Agencies for weatherization assistance.
