All mini-grant projects must...

- Be **created** and **led** by youth under 18
- Have **at least** one adult ally
- Be **financially sponsored** by a community-based nonprofit organization
- Have a budget that **matches the cycle requirements** (see table)
- Be **in San Francisco** and **for San Franciscans**
- Have 1 youth leader & adult ally **attend grantee gatherings**

Questions we ask to decide if your project is ready for funding...

Does the project meet a youth need?

For example: youth need a space to talk about being LGBTQ but there is no program like that at their school, so a group of young people apply for money to get snacks and materials to run meetings for LGBTQ students and allies.

Are you asking for a realistic amount of money?

We want to know that the money we give you is being spent wisely and reaching the most young people possible. If you apply for \$5,000 we understand that your project wouldn't be quite as large as if you're applying for \$10,000. If you apply for \$10,000 we want to see that you're making a real change for a LOT of youth.

Would the project be possible without financial support?

We know there are a lot of great ideas out there and our grants are just ONE way to make them happen. We want to make sure we are funding programs that really need our money to start or can't take their already great programs to the next level without our money.

Frequently asked questions:

What is YEF?

The Youth Empowerment Fund is a part of the San Francisco Department of Children Youth and Families run in partnership with Urban Services YMCA and is proudly funded by the San Francisco Children and Youth Fund. We give out mini-grants to youth-led projects that support youth in SF. We also run youth programs to support the leadership development and community advocacy of SF youth.

If I'm 18 or older can I apply for a mini-grant?

The two primary youth leaders on the project must be under 18. However, other youth on the project team can be 18 or older.

When does YEF accept applications for mini-grants?

We accept applications for mini-grants three times a year. Applications are released on our website one month before the final due date. For cycle deadlines see the table on Page 2. (www.yefsf.org)

When do I find out if my project has been funded?

YEF Community Funders takes about a month to review all applications, hold interviews, and make final funding decisions. Your project will usually be contacted within 2 weeks for an interview. 2 weeks after the interview you will be informed of the status of your application. *Note: this is a rough estimate; depending on the amount of applications received the process may be longer.*

Where else can I get funding for my youth-led project?

B.L.I.N.G. out of the Youth Leadership Institute and Youth Funding Youth Ideas (YFYI) out of CHALK are two other groups that give grants to youth-led projects.

How do I turn in my application?

Submit applications electronically to info@yefsf.org. Or, we accept paper applications in person on FRIDAYS at 1426 Fillmore Street, Suite 204. DO NOT DROP OFF OR SEND APPLICATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN YOUTH & THEIR FAMILIES.

Is there anything YEF cannot fund?

Yes, YEF money cannot go to adult staff wages/salaries, administrative fees and overhead costs, any expenses outside of San Francisco, bottled water, or tip/gratuity.

Glossary: a definition of terms used in this application

Adult Ally: An adult with the skills and commitment to support you through your project. This person usually works at the organization that is your fiscal sponsor but does not always have to.

Community: We mean this as whatever community you are a part of, where you live, where you go to school, your club or after-school program.

Fiscal Sponsor: The non-profit organization that will be giving you the money for your project up front. YEF only reimburses money that has already been spent. Your fiscal sponsor pays for your project's expenses and we pay them back at the end of every month. *Note: This organization must be a tax-exempt non-profit organization (501c3).*

Impact: The effect you will have on the community. For example, creating a tech program for girls will impact the girls in the program because they will learn important skills and it will impact the wider community because more women will work at tech companies.

Longevity: The ability for your project to continue on after your funding cycle is over. Have you created a project that will last, or a short-term project that will end once the cycle is over?

Mini-Grant: A small amount of money given to a youth-led project that does not need to be paid back.

Need: Something that there isn't enough of or something that's missing. For example, a community need for the SOMA neighborhood is more green space. There are so many buildings and streets and not enough trees or parks for youth to enjoy nature and play.

Project: The program, workshop or events your team needs money to do. The project should happen during the entire 6 month funding cycle.

Youth Leader: The person or people in charge of the project. This is who will be running the whole project, paying attention to the budget and communicating to YEF to tell us how the project is going.

Important information for adult allies and fiscal sponsor organizations:

- The Youth Empowerment Fund can only grant funds for youth-led project expenses. **Funds cannot augment existing program budgets.** Funds will only be provided for new or additional programming that is led by youth.
- **Fiscal sponsor fees or adult wages (for fiscal sponsor staff or adult allies) for any support given to youth are not approved expenses.** All support from adult allies and fiscal sponsor organizations is on a voluntary basis and cannot be financially compensated through YEF grant funds.
- Adult allies are required to **accompany at least 1 youth leader to 3 grantee gatherings** throughout the project cycle.
- YEF mini-grants are disbursed as **reimbursements** of paid project expenses. Your organization will be reimbursed monthly after approval of an invoice including detailed receipts and documentation.
- YEF does not reimburse for adult staff wages/salaries, administrative fees and overhead costs, ANY expenses outside San Francisco, bottled water, or tip/gratuity.
- **FULL REIMBURSEMENTS ARE CONTINGENT ON THE COMPLETION AND APPROVAL OF REIMBURSEMENT PACKETS.**

Guiding questions: What is the project? What will you do? Who is it for? Why are you doing it?

2. Explain why there is a need for this project?

Guiding Questions: Is there something missing from your community? Is there a program that youth really want but isn't available? Do you need money for equipment to get a project started or take it to the next level? Is this project a way to address a social issue?

3. Why is the project important?

Guiding Questions: Why is it important to you? How is it significant for your life and the life of your team? How is it significant for SF youth? Does the project create change?

4. What are the project goals & what activities will help achieve your goals?

Guiding Questions: What do you want to accomplish at the end of the project? What are the steps you will take to accomplish those things? How will your team work together to make it happen?

5. What kind of impact will your project have on the community?

Guiding Questions: Who/what will benefit from your project? What will youth gain from the project? How will the community as a whole benefit from your project? If you decide to continue the project how will you keep it going after the 6-month funding period has ended?

Budget

This is where you tell us how much money you need to make your project a reality! We want to know the details, so make sure to tell us exactly what you need and how much it's going to cost.

Remember to ask yourself: “does the amount of money I’m asking for match the amount of change or impact I’m making for youth in SF?”

For groups applying for larger grants (\$8,000-\$10,000), YEF will prioritize funding to project that show they are long-term, sustainable and have a strong impact.

Guidelines

- ✓ Remember that the total requested funds must be in line with the cycle awards
(*School-Year: Up to \$10k, Spring: Up to \$5k, Summer: Up to \$2,500*)
- ✓ Put items in their correct budget category.
Read the description of each category to know where each expense should be listed.
- ✓ Where possible, please provide proof of estimates for the items you list within the budget.
- ✓ The total amounts for each budget category listed in the worksheets should equal what is listed in the total budget worksheet on the previous page.
- ✗ Expenses that cannot be funded by YEF mini-grants include:
 - **Adult staff wages/salaries**
 - **Administrative fees and overhead costs**
 - **Travel expenses outside of San Francisco**
 - Bottled water
 - Tip/gratuity
 - Any expenses prohibited for grants with the City and County of San Francisco
