He is an active speaker, presenter and participant in various education-related programs. Reap was a featured speaker for a TEDx talk in Ashburn, Va., on the topic of inspiring students to succeed. He has participated in the Discovery Education Summer Institute Principal's Summit; United States Department of Education EdCamp; Maryland State Department of Education EDCamp and The Education Trust National Conference Baltimore.

Reap holds a Master's of Arts in Administration and Supervision from Bowie State University and a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania.

He is a member of the National Association of Elementary School Principals; National Council of Teachers of Mathematics; Maryland Association of Elementary School Principals; and Association of Supervision and Curriculum Development.

Cristo Rey Jesuit High School is a member of the Cristo Rey Network of 30 high schools across the country. Sponsored by the Maryland Province Jesuits, the school opened in 2007 and serves 350 college-bound students in grades 9-12. All Cristo Rey Jesuit students take a full course load of college preparatory classes and work five days

per month at one of 115 corporate partners through the Corporate Internship Program.
