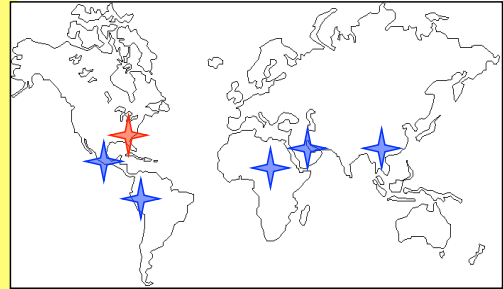


Red River Gorge: A World Hearth of Plant Domestication



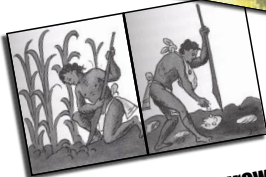
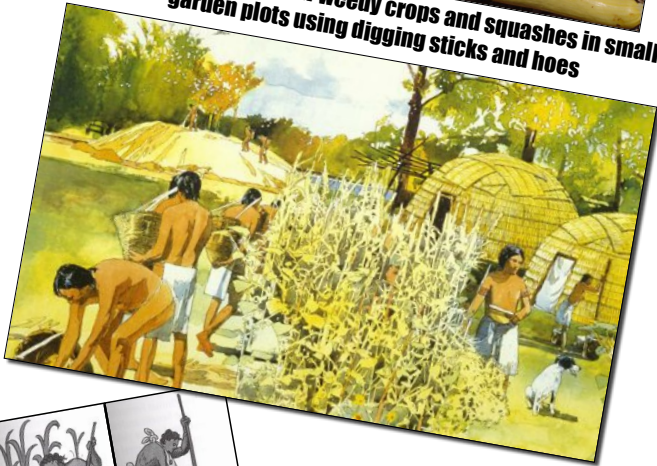
Did You Know ...

Native Americans domesticated eight species of seed-producing “weedy” plants called the Eastern Agricultural Complex

Native Americans grew weedy crops and squashes in small garden plots using digging sticks and hoes



Native Americans grew native crops as early as 5,000 years ago, long before they adopted corn and beans from Mexico

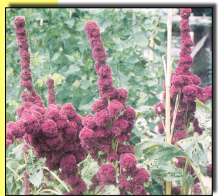
