Hi Paul & Rebecca,

A young false killer whale has live stranded in Tofino. DFO communications is on it. The animal seems to be in poor shape. The animals injuries/condition appears to be natural and not human caused. Calfs have a high mortality rate in their first year of life. Parks Canada and DFO fishery officers are on scene monitoring the condition of the animal and holding the animal above the surface. It is not clear at this point if the animal is capable of swimming off on it's own. Vancouver aquarium staff are enroute and should be on scene soon. This situation poses several challenges and difficult decisions. If this animal goes to the Vancouver aquarium rehabilitation centre and survives it would not be released back to the wild because of it's age. It would become a captive animal. Psuedo orcas can live for onwards of 30 years. Some options on what course of action include:

1) Animal transported back to vancouver aquarium and rehabilitated to become a captive animal.
